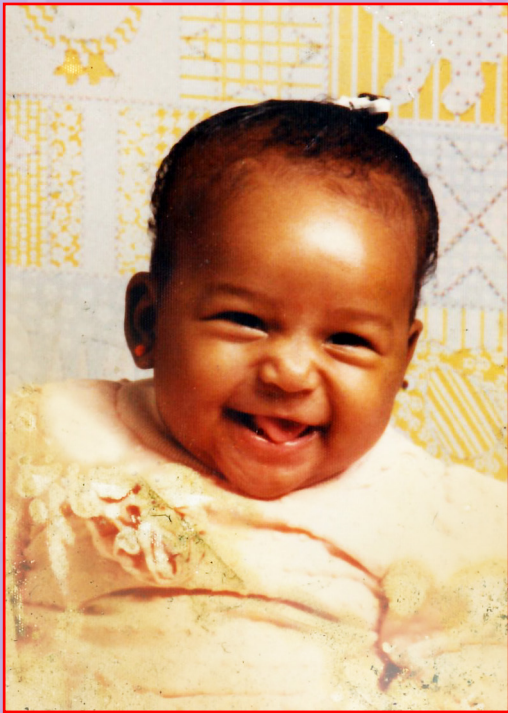
Ja-meece's Prayer
